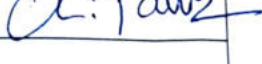
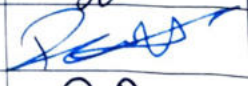

Minutes of the XIV Meeting of the Academic Council held on 16th June, 2026
(in online mode)

The Chairperson welcomed all the members to the online meeting of the Academic Council.

The following agenda items were discussed and deliberated upon

MIC/AC/14/01	To confirm the minutes of XIII Academic Council meeting held on 6 th March, 2026.
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Proposal: It is proposed to confirm the minutes of XIII Academic Council meeting held on 6th March, 2026. A copy of the Minutes of the XIII Academic Council Meeting is enclosed as Annexure-I.

Discussion: The members are reminded by the Chairperson that the minutes of the previous meeting were already circulated to them vide emails. The important points are quickly revised and the confirmation of the minutes was sought.

It is resolved to confirm the minutes of XIII Academic Council meeting held on 6th March, 2026

MIC/AC/14/02	To present the information regarding AICTE-EoA Approval for the A.Y: 2026-27.
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Proposal: The information regarding AICTE Extension of Approval (EoA) granted for the Academic Year 2026-27 was placed before the Academic Council. The AICTE Extension of Approval (EoA) Letter for A.Y. 2026-27 is enclosed as Annexure-II.

Discussion: The Chairperson informed the members that AICTE has granted Extension of Approval (EoA) for the Academic Year 2026-27. AICTE approved an increase in intake from 120 to 180 in B.Tech-Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning. The Council also noted the reduction in intake of MCA from 180 to 120, M.Tech-Power Electronics & Drives from 18 to 12, and M.Tech-VLSI & Embedded Systems from 18 to 12. The details of approved intake for various programmes were presented before the Council.

In this regard, Dr. P. Subba Rao, University Nominee suggested to obtain the approval for variation in intake from the Academic Council.

Resolution: The Academic Council noted and ratified the AICTE Extension of Approval (EoA) granted for the Academic Year 2026-27 and approved the revised intake in the respective programmes. Further, the Council resolved that any proposal for increase or decrease in intake, closure of programmes, or introduction of new programmes in future academic years shall be placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval before submission to AICTE.

MIC/AC/14/03	To consider & approve the IV yr B.Tech Course Structure and syllabus to be implemented from the A.Y: 2026-27
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Proposal: The proposed IV Year B.Tech Course Structure and Syllabus for the following disciplines under MIC23 Regulations, prepared in line with JNTUK R23 Course Structure and Syllabus, were placed before the Academic Council for its approval and ratification.

1. Civil Engineering
2. Electrical & Electronics Engineering
3. Mechanical Engineering
4. Electronics & Communication Engineering
5. Computer Science & Engineering
6. Information Technology
7. Artificial Intelligence & Data Science

The detailed Course Structures and Syllabi are enclosed as Annexure-III.

Discussion: The Academic Council perused the proposed IV Year Course Structure and Syllabus. During the Discussions, Dr. P. Subba Rao, University Nominee, suggested that the Professional Elective pools should be designed in such a way that they adequately represent the major specialization areas within each discipline, thereby providing students with wider academic exposure and flexibility in choosing electives. The Chairperson informed the members that the Course Structure and Syllabus had been adopted in line with the JNTUK R23 curriculum and University guidelines to maintain uniformity among affiliated colleges. Hence, no deviations were made from the prescribed curriculum. The members noted the suggestion of the University Nominee for consideration in future curriculum revisions, subject to University guidelines. The members examined the course contents and found them suitable for implementation from the Academic Year 2026-27.

Resolution: The Academic Council approved the IV Year B.Tech. Course Structure and Syllabi of the above mentioned disciplines under MIC23 Regulations for implementation from the Academic Year 2026–27.

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Proposal: The significant academic, research, placement, student achievements, and extension activities of the institution during the Academic Year 2025-26 is presented before the council.

Discussion: With the permission of the Chair, the following achievements and activities of the institution were presented before the Academic Council:

1. Research & Development Activities

- ATAL-sponsored FDP on “AI Meets Quantum Computing: Transforming Academic Paradigms” was organized by the Department of CSE during November 2025.
- ANRF-sponsored International Workshop on “Natural Language Processing Intent for Unmanned Aerial Vehicle” was organized by the Department of ECE during July 2025.
- A five-day FDP on “Sustainable Electric Vehicle Technologies and Renewable Energy Integration” was organized in collaboration with JNTUK during August 2025.
- During the Academic Year 2025-26, the institution achieved 07 Ph.D. awards, 98 research publications, 29 books published, 18 patents published, 04 awards received and 03 seminar grants. Faculty members actively participated in FDPs, workshops, conferences and seminars.

2. Student Skill Development and Certifications

- A total of 1,557 students successfully completed NPTEL/SWAYAM certification courses and 1,564 students completed EduSkills virtual internships.
- Several workshops, training programmes, boot camps, seminars and entrepreneurship development programmes were conducted across various departments to enhance students' technical and professional skills.

3. Training & Placement

- The 2026 passing-out batch secured 453 placement offers from 31 companies.
- The highest package offered was ₹7.1 LPA and the average package stood at ₹2.7 LPA.

4. Student Achievements

- Two IV Year IT students won a cash prize of \$1,000 at the AlgoBharat Hack Series 3.0 – Algorand India Developer Retreat, Goa.
- Students secured III Prize in the JNTUK Central Zone Kho-Kho Tournament and II Prize in the Kho-Kho Tournament organized by Vikas Group of Institutions.
- A student of IV B.Tech ECE won a Gold Medal in a Weightlifting Championship organized by St. Ann's Engineering College, Chirala.

5. Student and NSS Activities

- The college successfully organized the JNTUK Central Zone Cricket Tournament during January 2026.
- Anti-Drug Awareness Campaign "Drugs Pai Dandayatra" was organized in association with NTR Police Commissionerate.
- MICFEST 2026, Sankranti Celebrations, Mental Health Awareness Programmes, Plantation Drive, Blood Donation Camp, Medical Camp, Eye Check-up Camp,

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International Yoga Day, Swachh Andhra Pledge, National Unity Day Rally and other NSS activities were conducted during the Academic Year 2025-26.

The members appreciated the efforts of the Management, faculty, staff and students in achieving these milestones and contributing to the overall development and reputation of the institution.

Resolution: The Academic Council noted with appreciation the research accomplishments, placement achievements, student accomplishments, skill development initiatives, and NSS activities carried out during the Academic Year 2025-26.
